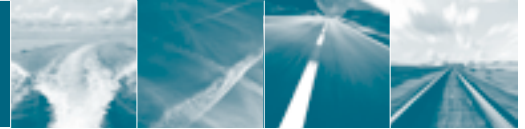

In addition to the standard customs declaration (Single Administrative Document - SAD) required for all shipments (except those within the European Union), shipments must be accompanied by the documents listed below.

a) Commercial invoice

Three copies, must indicate the origin of the goods.

b) EUR.1 certificate

Although Gabon does not have preferential arrangements in place for products originating in the EU, customs may require a movement certificate EUR.1 at the time of importing these products, particularly when they are incorporated in the manufacture of a local product and re-exported to the EU.

Consignments to the value of less than 6,000 euros, or those sent by a registered exporter may require the issue of a declaration (like the movement certificate EUR.1, when they are incorporated in the manufacture of a local product and re-exported to the EU). This declaration must be made on an invoice, a delivery note or any another commercial document which describes the products concerned in sufficient detail to enable them to be identified.

The declaration is as follows: The exporter of the products covered by this document (customs authorization No...) declares that, except where otherwise clearly indicated, these products are of... preferential origin ... (Signature of the exporter; in addition, the name of the person signing the declaration has to be indicated in clear script).

c) Certificate of origin

For products of non-EU origin which cannot benefit from a movement certificate EUR.1, and for non-EU originating products, a certificate of origin is required and it must conform to the EU FORM A specimen.

d) Phytosanitary certificate

For fruit, vegetables, seeds. The certificate is issued by the phytosanitary service of the regions of origin (on request of the party concerned 10 days before product shipment).

e) Export Health Certificate

Required for meat products. This certificate is issued by the veterinary service of the local Health Authority.

Please note! An outbreak of Schmallenberg virus has caused many importers to put embargoes in place.

In the absence of other information, it is advisable to contact the importer.

f) Certificate or declaration of free sale for cosmetics

Not required.

Gabon / Formality and certificate for export

TEMPORARY ADMISSION

ATA Carnet

The Customs Convention on the ATA Carnet for the Temporary Admission of Goods (ATA Convention) has been adopted by Gabon for commercial samples only; all other shipments are made through an agent in accordance with common law.

TRANSPORT

a) Transport document

b) Packing list

c) Transport insurance

Pursuant to national legislation, all shipments to Gabon with an FOB value equal to or more than 300,000 CFA must be insured locally.

d) Cargo tracking note

This is obligatory for shipments by sea.

Exporters will incur heavy fines in the absence of this document.

e) Treatment of wood packaging
